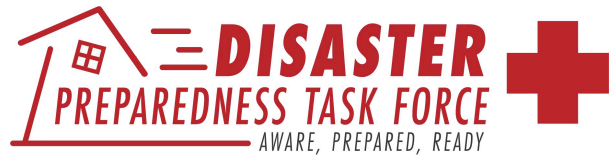


Disaster Preparedness Task Force

The attachments to this letter have information for you to consider in making yourself ready for an emergency.

- Review the reverse side for tips on how to turn off your electricity, water and gas (for some manors).
- Review the material on suggested preparedness you can do to shelter-in-place in your manor for three weeks, which may be required for a major disaster and putting together a "Go-Bag" of critical items.
- See website for upcoming free-to-residents First Aid, AED and CPR classes available to you in the Village.
- In a medical emergency, paramedics look at the patient's bathroom medicine cabinet (envelope on mirror if no medicine cabinet) to locate an envelope labeled "EMERGENCY MEDICAL INFORMATION". If you are unable to respond, this information you fill out (attached) and put in the envelope could save your life!

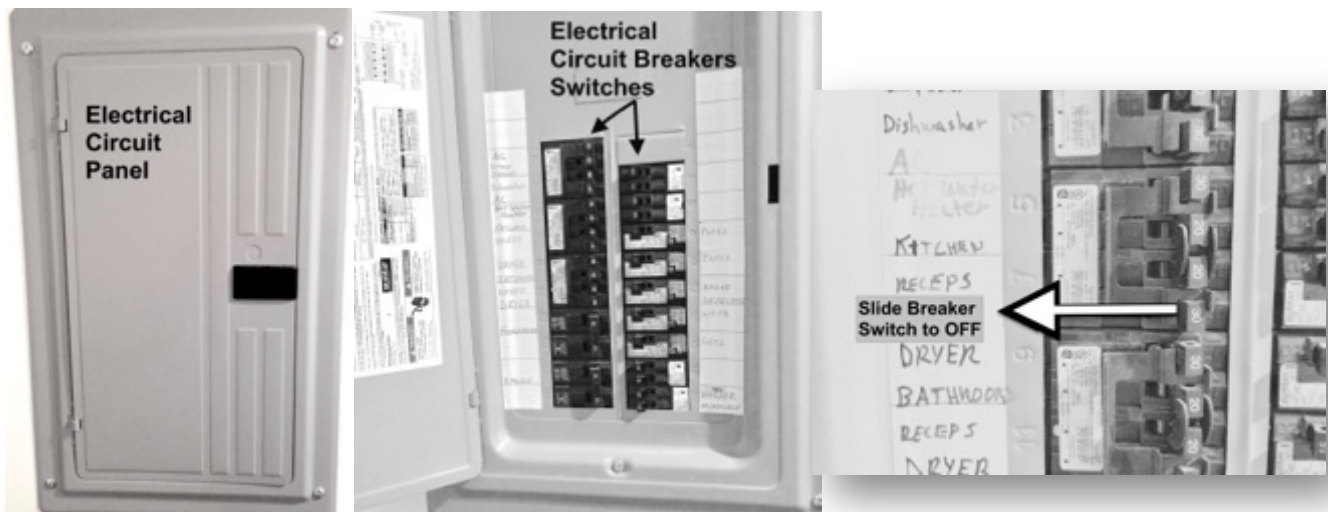
Experts from the California Institute of Technology and USGS recommend preparation for a major earthquake that can severely impact our area – let's be prepared, just in case.

In the event of a major disaster, you may need to do the following things for your safety.

If you have broken bathroom or kitchen fixtures, you may need to turn off the water to avoid flooding. Turn the valve clockwise (right) to turn the water off to the fixture.



If you see, smell or hear arcing, sparks, smoke or fire, you should open your electric circuit breaker panel on the wall of your manor and slide the circuit breakers to the off position.



Turn off the gas valve, with a wrench, if you smell gas in the manor (only applies to a few manors that have gas)
